



A typical situation in which the **HANDS-FREE** telephone shows its versatile uses.

Let's suppose you're having a conference of four or five associates and it's necessary to get information from an outside source, while you make notes and the rest listen or join in.



Depress the "On" button. In a moment, an operator will answer or, if you have dial service, you'll hear dial tone. Ask for or dial the party desired.



Your called party answers and you and the rest hear his voice as if you were listening to the radio. You make notes or look up facts and figures. Comes the time when others in your group want to get into the discussion.



Put the mike in the center of the group. Everyone simultaneously talks at it. Tests show the system highly efficient even if the back of the mike is to the speaker, or the microphone is lying flat on the table.



And if you don't want the distant party to hear what your own group is saying, just press the "Muting" button—and the mike goes temporarily dead.



If you want your other party to tell you something the others shouldn't hear, simply pick up the handset. This instantly changes the instrument to "standard" reception.



To return to loudspeaker operation, press the "On" button and, while holding it down, replace the handset. Now you're right back where you were—with everybody in the act!



To ring off, just press the "Off" button, if you're on loudspeaker, or if you're using the instrument as a standard telephone, just hang up the handset.

The situations shown on the front cover are but five of dozens in which a *Hands-Free* telephone will prove a great boon.

The instrument itself is a Stromberg-Carlson telephone to which have been added a special sub-base of electronic parts, a built-in loudspeaker, and a separate microphone. It can be used exactly as any standard telephone. In addition, it has the ability to provide two-way conversation even when both your hands are completely occupied.

In brief, *you* (or anyone else within fifteen feet of it) talk into the microphone—and the 'phone talks right back to you! And distance is no problem—the person with whom you're conversing can be just down the hall or halfway across the country.

Installation is a matter of minutes—cost is extremely low—and the increase in business efficiency is certainly welcome these busy modern days.

EXPLANATION OF REFERENCE MARKS

- Standard modern desk instrument in pleasing gray; can be either manual or dial.
- Handset is picked up and used as on any regular telephone when *Hands-Free* feature isn't needed.
- "On" button. Merely depressing this puts both mike and loudspeaker into operation.
- "Off" button—does the same thing as when you hang up the handset of your present telephone.
- Signal light. Will remain lighted as long as *Hands-Free* loudspeaker function is in operation.
- Muting button. Because the microphone stays

"live" while you are using the instrument, this button may be depressed if you don't want the party at the other end to hear what people around you are saying.

g. Volume control—to raise the level of the voice coming through the loudspeaker.

h. Microphone, with 12 feet of cord. (Extra extension available.) Can be passed around or set down in the middle of a group. Has Automatic Volume Control to prevent "booming" if you are very close.

i. Speaker built into the sub-base of the instrument and covered with an attractive grille.

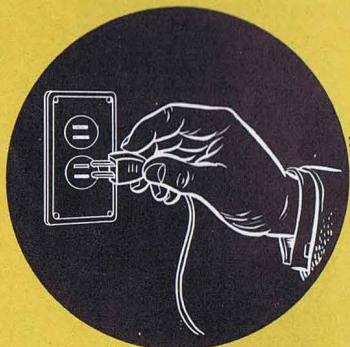
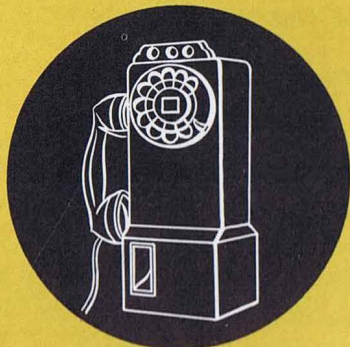
- The microphone is separate —there is no need to move a bulky instrument around for a group to use.

There are a number of devices on the market to provide telephone conversation without the need to hold a handset. We sincerely believe the instrument we offer is very superior, for several reasons.

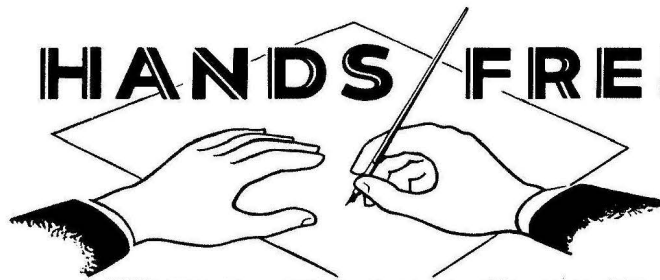
